Message from the Principal

Everybody is back!

It was great to see all students able to return to school last week as we were able to stop rostering students home. We have all been impressed and humbled by the support and understanding that the community has demonstrated over the first part of the 2022 school year. We are pleased to see attendance returning to normal levels (accounting for those isolating due to COVID-19 protocols) and thank you all for taking this step so promptly.

Changes to daily numbers and COVID-19 protocols

As you may have seen, in the last few days the media has reported a reduction in the number of daily cases.

While we know that cases in school will rise and fall with that of the level in our community, our health experts tell us that children are much more likely to be exposed to COVID-19 in the community than at school. We also know that nationally in mid-March no more than 4% of teachers in any seven-day period reported as testing positive. It is currently around 3.5%.

As you know, it's great for any child's wellbeing and learning to be at school with their friends, teachers and other school staff. You also know that we have very good systems in place to keep everyone as safe as possible. This is why we remain open at Red.

I would like to remind you that in our school we are keeping the additional layers of protection in place to help prevent or reduce the risk of onward spread. We know that being fully vaccinated and boosted reduces the risk of severe illness due to COVID-19. We are encouraging all adults in our school who are working with students to be vaccinated including their booster. If they are eligible, I encourage you to get your child vaccinated, too.

If you have any concerns about sending your child to school, please get in touch – our team are here to help. We want children to be at school and engaging in learning with their friends.

Your job remains the same, too: please continue to keep a really close watch of your whānau for anyone with symptoms. If unwell, please stay at home and get advice about getting a COVID-19 test.

Polyfest 2022

This year Polyfest was quite different than any previous year. Without an audience to cheer and food stall aromas, students from different cultural groups mixed and supported each other, it was hard to imagine how the Festival would work. There was only one group representing Papatoetoe High School at this year's event – the Fijian Group. Despite the disrupted practices due to years rostering and students isolating plus the new Polyfest conditions, they got into the spirit of this event from the moment they stepped on the bus. With a lot of hard work, they managed to put an outstanding performance, finishing **3rd** overall out of all the different cultural groups over the 2 days & **1st place** for the Oceania Continent Division.
