Welcome – once again

We had hoped for things to be a little smoother than they have been, but as we have learned frequently over the last few years, things can change quickly, indeed. Connections and communication with you are vital to being able to create a meaning experience for students here at school so, please make sure you keep you contacts details up to date (call the office or use the parent portal if you need to make changes) and also follow FaceBook/Instagram pages as we also use these a great deal for our more regular communication.

Punctuality to school

Being punctual and arriving on time to school in the morning is critical for a variety of reasons. For starters, it instils valuable life skills such as responsibility and the discipline of a routine. Additionally, it ensures that students don't miss any crucial announcements or content in their lessons, which can have a significant impact on academic success. Furthermore, arriving on time sets a positive tone for the rest of the day, allowing students to start their day off on the right foot and remain focused and productive. Ultimately, being on time to school in the morning is an essential part of developing good habits and achieving academic success. Students are asked to be at school no later than 8.40am (ready for classes to start at 8.45am) Mon, Tues, Thu, Fri and by 9.40am on a Wednesday. Your support with this is greatly appreciated.

Dropping students to school / picking students up after school

When dropping off students at school, it's important to pay close attention to parking signs in Nicholson Ave and Carlie St. Signs indicating drop-off zones, no parking areas, and restricted hours are posted to ensure the safety of students, road users and residents. These signs are designed to keep traffic moving and prevent congestion, so it's essential to follow them carefully. By adhering to the parking signs and procedures, you can help ensure a safe and efficient drop-off experience for everyone involved. We would recommend not using Nicholson Ave or Carlie St between 8.30-8.45am and 3.10-3.30pm as there is significant foot traffic at these times and collecting/dropping off your child would be a lot safer and faster if you use surrounding streets.

Tips to help parents engage in their student learning

- 1. Attend welcome interviews: This is a great opportunity to meet your child's teachers and get an understanding of your child's academic progress and any concerns the teachers may have.
- 2. Communicate with teachers: Regularly communicate with your child's teachers via email, phone calls, or in-person meetings. This will help you stay updated on your child's progress and address any concerns.
- 3. Volunteer: Get involved in school activities and events, such as volunteering in student activities or chaperoning field trips. This will not only show your child that you care about their education, but it will also help you build relationships with other parents, teachers, and staff.
- 4. Stay informed: Stay informed about school policies, programs, and activities. Read school newsletters and follow the school's social media pages.
