### NZQA and external NCEA exams

We would like to clarify the end of year NCEA examinations which are scheduled from 22 November - 14 December 2021. NZQA have confirmed that any students not attending their external exams will be given their school unexpected event grades (UEG) automatically. However, it is still the Government's expectation that NCEA exams will proceed as normal for all students, **unless** they have a Covid-specific reason for not attending.

**Students** who are satisfied with their school UEG grades **may choose** not to attend external exams because (and these are Covid specific reasons for not attending):

- They are worried about the Covid risk of sitting in a room with 100+ students and staff
- They are not yet fully vaccinated
- They have a non-covid related sickness, injury or family incident
- They have experienced significant disadvantage in the weeks leading up to the examinations (lockdown is a significant disadvantage)

If a **student** chooses to **not attend** the external exam they do **not** have to inform the school or NZQA of the reason why, nor do they have to produce any evidence. They will **automatically receive** their school UEG grades.

We are recommending that families think carefully about the anxiety that examinations bring in Covid times and **make the decision** that works best for them. We will continue to support students entered into NCEA throughout the rest of the school year as they work hard to provide evidence to support a UEG grade. If you have any specific UEG questions, please talk to your subject teacher in the first instance.

Our school will publish UEG grades in the results section of the school portal from now and up to 15 December. Students who would like to improve on their UEG can attend their external exam or work with their class teacher up to 10 December. They will be awarded the higher grade between their school issued UEG and actual grade they may earn if they sit the exam in person.

### Prizegiving 2021

It is with great sadness I must inform you that we have made the decision to cancel all awards and prizegiving ceremonies for 2021. Even if Auckland was to reach the current vaccination target, it would see us move to the red alert level in the newly announced COVID-19 Protection Framework and this alert level continues to have restrictions on mass gatherings. We will find a way to honour award recipients and anticipate that we will do this via email and posting winners names to our website and publishing in our annual school magazine.

### Student Leadership 2022

We would normally be right in the thick of the process we follow to appoint our 2022 student leadership team. Again, as you can imagine, this is proving far more difficult with our current alert level settings. We will be polling all students in Y12 next week to seek their views, but have decided to hold the appointment process over until the first week or two of 2022.
